The Enterprise Zone Development Agency was created pursuant to Section 290.0056, Florida Statutes. Whereas, the Board of County Commissioners of Sumter County, and the city councils of the cities of Webster, Coleman and Center Hill adopted resolutions supporting the creation of the Enterprise Zone Development Agency. The Sumter County Board of County Commissioners is the Coordinator for the Enterprise Zone Development Agency and is the lead entity to coordinate the economic activities within the Zone.

When the governing body creates an enterprise zone development agency, that body shall appoint a board of commissioners of the agency, which shall consist of not fewer than 8 or more than 13 commissioners. The governing body may appoint at least one representative from each of the following: the local chamber of commerce, local financial or insurance entities, local businesses and, where possible, businesses operating within the nominating area; the residents residing within the nominating area; nonprofit community-based organizations operating within the nominating area; the regional workforce board; the local code enforcement agency; and the local law enforcement agency. The terms of office of the commissioners shall be for 4 years, except that, in making the initial appointments, the governing body shall appoint two members for terms of 3 years, two members for terms of 2 years and one member for a term of 1 year; the remaining initial members shall serve for terms of 4 years. A vacancy occurring during a term shall be filled for the unexpired term. The importance of including individuals from the nominated area shall be considered in making appointments. Further, the importance of minority representation on the agency shall be considered in making appointments so that the agency generally reflects the gender and ethnic composition of the community as a whole.
